WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 8. Policies, etc., to be followed, and records



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Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 8. (1) Where the Act or this Regulation requires the licensee of a long-term care home to have, institute or otherwise put in place any plan, policy, protocol, procedure, strategy or system, the licensee is required to ensure that the plan, policy, protocol, procedure, strategy or system,
- (a) is in compliance with and is implemented in accordance with applicable requirements under the Act; and O. Reg. 79/10, s. 8 (1).
- (b) is complied with. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 8 (1).

Findings/Faits saillants:

- 1. 1. The home's policy 4.1.2 Abuse and Neglect Prevention, under Procedure 6 states that:
- 6.a. an investigation shall be commenced immediately. While the investigation is being conducted:
- 6.b. The suspected/accused staff member shall be relieved of their duties with pay.
- 6.c.The suspected/accused volunteer shall be escorted from the building and prevented from visiting or having contact with the resident during the investigation.

The home identified a person suspected of stealing a large sum of money from a specific resident, by way of photos provided by the police. The home did not remove the person from the home. This has been confirmed by the licensee, administrator and the DOC.

The licensee, administrator and DOC have confirmed that no investigation has been started by the home. [s. 8. (1)]

Additional Required Actions:

CO # - 901 was served on the licensee. Refer to the "Order(s) of the Inspector".

WN #2: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 75. Screening measures

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 75. (2) The screening measures shall include criminal reference checks, unless the person being screened is under 18 years of age. 2007, c. 8, s. 75. (2).

Findings/Faits saillants:



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1. The licensee has failed to do a criminal reference check prior to hiring staff members. Three personnel hired since July 1, 2011 were reviewed. Two of the three did not have a criminal reference check completed. This information was confirmed by the Administrator. [s. 75. (2)]

Additional Required Actions:

CO # - 001 will be served on the licensee. Refer to the "Order(s) of the Inspector".

WN #3: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 3. Residents' Bill of Rights



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Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 3. (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the following rights of residents are fully respected and promoted:
- 1. Every resident has the right to be treated with courtesy and respect and in a way that fully recognizes the resident's individuality and respects the resident's dignity. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 2. Every resident has the right to be protected from abuse. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 3. Every resident has the right not to be neglected by the licensee or staff. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 4. Every resident has the right to be properly sheltered, fed, clothed, groomed and cared for in a manner consistent with his or her needs. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 5. Every resident has the right to live in a safe and clean environment. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 6. Every resident has the right to exercise the rights of a citizen. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 7. Every resident has the right to be told who is responsible for and who is providing the resident's direct care. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 8. Every resident has the right to be afforded privacy in treatment and in caring for his or her personal needs. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 9. Every resident has the right to have his or her participation in decision-making respected. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 10. Every resident has the right to keep and display personal possessions, pictures and furnishings in his or her room subject to safety requirements and the rights of other residents. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 11. Every resident has the right to,
- i. participate fully in the development, implementation, review and revision of his or her plan of care,
- ii. give or refuse consent to any treatment, care or services for which his or her consent is required by law and to be informed of the consequences of giving or refusing consent,
- iii. participate fully in making any decision concerning any aspect of his or her care, including any decision concerning his or her admission, discharge or transfer to or from a long-term care home or a secure unit and to obtain an independent opinion with regard to any of those matters, and
- iv. have his or her personal health information within the meaning of the Personal Health Information Protection Act, 2004 kept confidential in



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accordance with that Act, and to have access to his or her records of personal health information, including his or her plan of care, in accordance with that Act. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).

- 12. Every resident has the right to receive care and assistance towards independence based on a restorative care philosophy to maximize independence to the greatest extent possible. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 13. Every resident has the right not to be restrained, except in the limited circumstances provided for under this Act and subject to the requirements provided for under this Act. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 14. Every resident has the right to communicate in confidence, receive visitors of his or her choice and consult in private with any person without interference. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 15. Every resident who is dying or who is very ill has the right to have family and friends present 24 hours per day. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 16. Every resident has the right to designate a person to receive information concerning any transfer or any hospitalization of the resident and to have that person receive that information immediately. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 17. Every resident has the right to raise concerns or recommend changes in policies and services on behalf of himself or herself or others to the following persons and organizations without interference and without fear of coercion, discrimination or reprisal, whether directed at the resident or anyone else,
 - i. the Residents' Council,
 - ii. the Family Council,
- iii. the licensee, and, if the licensee is a corporation, the directors and officers of the corporation, and, in the case of a home approved under Part VIII, a member of the committee of management for the home under section 132 or of the board of management for the home under section 125 or 129,
 - iv. staff members,
 - v. government officials,
- vi. any other person inside or outside the long-term care home. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 18. Every resident has the right to form friendships and relationships and to participate in the life of the long-term care home. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 19. Every resident has the right to have his or her lifestyle and choices respected. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 20. Every resident has the right to participate in the Residents' Council. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).



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- 21. Every resident has the right to meet privately with his or her spouse or another person in a room that assures privacy. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 22. Every resident has the right to share a room with another resident according to their mutual wishes, if appropriate accommodation is available. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 23. Every resident has the right to pursue social, cultural, religious, spiritual and other interests, to develop his or her potential and to be given reasonable assistance by the licensee to pursue these interests and to develop his or her potential. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 24. Every resident has the right to be informed in writing of any law, rule or policy affecting services provided to the resident and of the procedures for initiating complaints. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 25. Every resident has the right to manage his or her own financial affairs unless the resident lacks the legal capacity to do so. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 26. Every resident has the right to be given access to protected outdoor areas in order to enjoy outdoor activity unless the physical setting makes this impossible. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).
- 27. Every resident has the right to have any friend, family member, or other person of importance to the resident attend any meeting with the licensee or the staff of the home. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).

Findings/Faits saillants:

- 1. The licensee failed to ensure that the following rights of residents are fully respected and promoted:
- 2. Every resident has the right to be protected from abuse.
- i. The home was notified by resident 001's family on that there had been misappropriation of money from the resident's bank account.
- ii. The home was notified by the family of resident 001 of a second theft of \$100 cash from the resident's room.
- iii. The home did not commence an internal investigation into the missing money on either occasion. This was confirmed by the licensee, the Administrator and the DOC.
- iv. The home learned of a specific person suspected of misappropriating resident 001's money on from photographs provided by police. The home did not protect the resident from possible further financial abuse by failing to investigate the initial incident of theft as per their abuse policy. This information was confirmed by the licensee, the administrator and the DOC. [s. 3. (1)]



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WN #4: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 6. Plan of care

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 6. (10) The licensee shall ensure that the resident is reassessed and the plan of care reviewed and revised at least every six months and at any other time when,
- (a) a goal in the plan is met; 2007, c. 8, s. 6 (10).
- (b) the resident's care needs change or care set out in the plan is no longer necessary; or 2007, c. 8, s. 6 (10).
- (c) care set out in the plan has not been effective. 2007, c. 8, s. 6 (10).

Findings/Faits saillants:

- The licensee did not ensure that the resident is re-assessed and the plan of care reviewed and revised at least every six months and at any other time when,
 (b) the resident's care needs change or care set out in the plan is no longer necessary.
- i. According to the health record, resident 001 has had multiple falls over several months. On a certain date, it was observed that a falls mat had been placed on the floor on the right side of the resident's bed and both bedrails were in the raised position while the resident was sitting in the bed. The current plan of care has not been revised to reflect these interventions. [s. 6. (10)]

WN #5: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 24. Reporting certain matters to Director



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Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 24. (1) A person who has reasonable grounds to suspect that any of the following has occurred or may occur shall immediately report the suspicion and the information upon which it is based to the Director:
- 1. Improper or incompetent treatment or care of a resident that resulted in harm or a risk of harm to the resident. 2007, c. 8, ss. 24 (1), 195 (2).
- 2. Abuse of a resident by anyone or neglect of a resident by the licensee or staff that resulted in harm or a risk of harm to the resident. 2007, c. 8, ss. 24 (1), 195 (2).
- 3. Unlawful conduct that resulted in harm or a risk of harm to a resident. 2007, c. 8, ss. 24 (1), 195 (2).
- 4. Misuse or misappropriation of a resident's money. 2007, c. 8, ss. 24 (1), 195 (2).
- 5. Misuse or misappropriation of funding provided to a licensee under this Act or the Local Health System Integration Act, 2006. 2007, c. 8, ss. 24 (1), 195 (2).

Findings/Faits saillants:

- 1. The licensee did not immediately report to the Director the misuse or misappropriation of a resident's money.
- 1. The home was notified by the resident's family member by phone that resident money was missing from a bank account on a certain date. The Critical Incident was sent to the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care 2 days later. There were no calls made to the office or pager. [s. 24. (1)]
