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INSPECTION RESULTS

WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Safe and Secure Home

NC #001 Written Notification pursuant to FLTCA, 2021, s. 154 (1) 1.

Non-compliance with: O.Reg. 246/22, s. 12 (1) 3.

The licensee failed to ensure that the door leading to the maintenance room was kept closed and locked when not being supervised by staff.

During a tour of the Long-Term Care home on February 15, 2023, the maintenance door was observed to have been held open using three pails of fabric softener. Inspector #739 entered the room and there were no staff in the room at the time. The home's Infection Prevention and Conrtol (IPAC) Lead was walking by the room and observed that the door was open.

During an interview with a maintenance worker they stated that they had stepped away from the room for a few minutes.

During an interview with the IPAC Lead they acknowledged that the door should have been closed and locked as it was a non-residential area.
