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Pain management

s. 57 (1) The pain management program must, at a minimum, provide for the following:

4. Monitoring of residents' responses to, and the effectiveness of, the pain management strategies.

The licensee failed to comply with the home's pain management program when they failed to monitor a resident's responses to, and the effectiveness of pain management strategies that were newly implemented.

In accordance with O. Reg. 246/22 s. 11 (1)(b), the licensee is required to ensure that written policies for the pain management program were complied with.

Specifically, the home's pain management program stated that a pain assessment was to be conducted when pain medication was changed. A resident did not have any pain assessments or re-evaluation of their pain after their medication was changed.
