Inspection Summary/Résumé de l'inspection

The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Complaint inspection.

This inspection was conducted on the following date(s): September 16 and 17, 2020

The following were inspected:

- Log # 014218-20: a complaint related to a resident's death**
- Log # 014859-20: a critical incident report (CIS# 2642-000012-20) related to a resident's death**

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with the Administrator, Director of Care (DOC), Assistant Director of Care (ADOC), several Registered Nurses (RNs) and several residents.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector reviewed resident health care records, medication administration records, shift change reports, daily monitoring reports, Coroner correspondance and staff education.

WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 6. Plan of care

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 6. (4) The licensee shall ensure that the staff and others involved in the different aspects of care of the resident collaborate with each other,

(a) in the assessment of the resident so that their assessments are integrated and are consistent with and complement each other; and 2007, c. 8, s. 6 (4).

(b) in the development and implementation of the plan of care so that the different aspects of care are integrated and are consistent with and complement each other. 2007, c. 8, s. 6 (4).

Findings/Faits saillants :

1. The licensee has failed to ensure that staff involved in the care of a resident collaborate with each other in the assessment of the resident so that their assessments are integrated, consistent with and complement each other

A resident expressed having pain with or without shortness of breath ten (10) times over a period of 14 days. The resident's pain and shortness of breath were assessed by the registered nursing staff. Health care records documented that the resident's attending physician was not notified by registered nursing staff of the resident's episodes of pain. DOC and ADOC said that the resident's pain was reported between registered staff at unit shift reports but was not brought forward to their attention for follow-up during daily morning reports. They were not notified of the resident's change in health status until the day of the resident's transfer to hospital.

The DOC and ADOC said that this lack communication between registered nursing staff, themselves and the attending physician meant that reassessment of the resident's health condition was not done prior to the resident's transfer to hospital.

Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure staff and others involved in the different aspects of care collaborate with each other in the assessment of the resident so that their assessments are integrated, consistent with and complement each other, to be implemented voluntarily.

WN #2: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 30. General requirements

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 30. (2) The licensee shall ensure that any actions taken with respect to a resident under a program, including assessments, reassessments, interventions and the resident's responses to interventions are documented. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 30 (2).

Findings/Faits saillants :

1. The licensee has failed to ensure that any actions taken with respect to a resident, including assessments and reassessments of vital signs are documented.

A resident expressed having pain with or without shortness of breath ten (10) times over a period of 14 days. The resident's pain and shortness of breath were assessed by the registered nursing staff however on four (4) occasions the resident's vital signs were not documented in the resident's health care record.

Two RNs said that when a resident is unwell and vital signs need to be taken as part of the assessment process, these are to be documented in the resident's health care record. When these are not clearly documented, there are no comparative values for follow-up assessments of residents' health status.
