Inspection Summary/Résumé de l'inspection



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The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Complaint inspection.

This inspection was conducted on the following date(s): March 2-5, 2021.

The following complaints were inspected during this inspection:

One Complaint regarding allegations of resident safety concerns; and

One Complaint regarding allegations of resident care concerns.

A concurrent Critical Incident System Inspection was also conducted during this inspection.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with the Administrator (ADM), Director of Care (DOC), Assistant Directors of Care (ADOCs), Restorative Care, Housekeeping staff, Registered Nurses (RNs), Registered Practical Nurses (RPNs), Personal Support Workers (PSWs) and residents.

The Inspector(s) also conducted daily tours of resident care areas, observed the provision of care and services to residents, observed staff to resident interactions, reviewed health care records, and internal investigation files, staff personal files, and reviewed relevant policies, and programs.

WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 20. Policy to promote zero tolerance

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 20. (1) Without in any way restricting the generality of the duty provided for in section 19, every licensee shall ensure that there is in place a written policy to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents, and shall ensure that the policy is complied with. 2007, c. 8, s. 20 (1).

Findings/Faits saillants:



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1. The licensee has failed to ensure that their written policy to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents was complied with related to an incident of abuse involving two residents.

A Critical Incident System (CIS) report was submitted to the Director, regarding an incident of abuse involving two residents. The CIS report indicated that a PSW witnessed a resident being abused by another resident. The CIS report indicated that the doctor had been notified of the incident one day after it occurred.

A review of the resident's progress notes indicated that the doctor was notified by a RN, who discussed the details of the incident with them, two days after the incident had occurred.

The licensee's policy identified that staff were to contact the Physician for further assessment and communicate the status of the resident.

The Director of Care verified that that doctor was not notified immediately about the abuse as they should have been, per the home's policy.

Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that their written policy to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents was complied with, to be implemented voluntarily.



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WN #2: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 98. Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the appropriate police force is immediately notified of any alleged, suspected or witnessed incident of abuse or neglect of a resident that the licensee suspects may constitute a criminal offence. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 98.

Findings/Faits saillants:

1. The licensee has failed to ensure that the appropriate police force was immediately notified of any alleged, suspected or witnessed incident of abuse or neglect of a resident that the licensee suspects may constitute a criminal offence.

See WN #1 for details. The CIS report did not indicate that the police had been notified of the incident.

A review of the home's internal investigation file identified that the police were notified three days after the incident occurred.

The Director of Care (DOC) verified that the police had not been contacted until three days after the abuse had occurred.

Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that the appropriate police force was immediately notified of any alleged, suspected or witnessed incident of abuse or neglect of a resident that the licensee suspects may constitute a criminal offence, to be implemented voluntarily.



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WN #3: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 24. Reporting certain matters to Director

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 24. (1) A person who has reasonable grounds to suspect that any of the following has occurred or may occur shall immediately report the suspicion and the information upon which it is based to the Director:
- 1. Improper or incompetent treatment or care of a resident that resulted in harm or a risk of harm to the resident. 2007, c. 8, s. 24 (1), 195 (2).
- 2. Abuse of a resident by anyone or neglect of a resident by the licensee or staff that resulted in harm or a risk of harm to the resident. 2007, c. 8, s. 24 (1), 195 (2).
- 3. Unlawful conduct that resulted in harm or a risk of harm to a resident. 2007, c. 8, s. 24 (1), 195 (2).
- 4. Misuse or misappropriation of a resident's money. 2007, c. 8, s. 24 (1), 195 (2).
- 5. Misuse or misappropriation of funding provided to a licensee under this Act or the Local Health System Integration Act, 2006. 2007, c. 8, s. 24 (1), 195 (2).

Findings/Faits saillants:

1. The licensee has failed to ensure that a person who had reasonable grounds to suspect that abuse of a resident by a resident that resulted in harm or a risk of harm, immediately reported the suspicion and the information upon which it is based to the Director.

See WN #1 for details. The CIS report identified that the incident occurred on a specific date; however, the incident of abuse was not reported to the Director until one day later.

The Director of Care (DOC) confirmed that the resident abuse had not been reported to the Director immediately and that they reported it one day later, when they became aware of the incident.
