### Non-Compliance Remedied

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## **WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Safe Storage of Drugs**

NC #002 Written Notification pursuant to FLTCA, 2021, s. 154 (1) 1.

Non-compliance with: O. Reg. 246/22, s. 138 (1) (a) (ii)

Safe storage of drugs

- s. 138 (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that,
- (a) drugs are stored in an area or a medication cart,
- (ii) that is secure and locked,

The licensee has failed to ensure that two residents had their drugs stored in an area that was secure and locked, specifically their prescribed creams.

**Sources:** observations of two resident rooms; record review of the licensee's policy titled CareRx The Medication Pass Policy; and interviews with staff.

## WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Safe Storage of Drugs

Non-compliance with: O. Reg. 246/22, s. 138 (1) (b)

Safe storage of drugs

s. 138 (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that,

(b) controlled substances are stored in a separate, double-locked stationary cupboard in the locked area or stored in a separate locked area within the locked medication cart.

The licensee has failed to ensure that a controlled substance was stored in a separate, double-locked stationary cupboard in the locked area, specifically on September 4, 2025 the drug ativan was stored in a locked box, inside an unlocked vaccine fridge.
