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WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 3. Residents' Bill of Rights

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 3. (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the following rights of residents are fully respected and promoted:
- 8. Every resident has the right to be afforded privacy in treatment and in caring for his or her personal needs. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).

Findings/Faits saillants:

- 1. The licensee failed to fully respect and promote the resident's right to be afforded privacy in treatment and in caring for his or her personal needs as evidenced by:
- a) Interview with resident #003 revealed the physician often approaches residents in the hall to ask how they are doing and anyone sitting in the hall can hear about the resident's health treatment.
- b) Resident #003 shared that they write information down in a notebook that he or she would like to share with the physician during the next visit and often the visit occurs in the hallway denying the resident the opportunity to retrieve the notebook to discuss pertinent health issues privately and in an appropriate location.
- c) Interview with resident #003 revealed the resident received a chest assessment by stethoscope in the hallway by the physician. The home's physician did not deny doing a chest assessment by stethoscope in the hall for resident #003.
- d) Interview with resident #001 revealed the physician has spoke to him or her regarding ongoing health issues while attending a meeting in the activity room and has visited the resident in the dining room during lunch at least once this year. Resident #001 shared that there is hesitation to discuss health issues in the dining room and the physician should only talk about health related issues in private. [s. 3. (1) 8.]
