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WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Recreational cannabis

NC #001 Written Notification pursuant to FLTCA, 2021, s. 154 (1) 1.

Non-compliance with: O. Reg. 246/22, s. 142 (1)

Recreational cannabis

s. 142 (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that there are written policies and procedures to govern, with respect to residents, the cultivation, acquisition, consumption, administration, possession, storage and disposal of recreational cannabis in accordance with all applicable laws, including, without being limited to, the Cannabis Act (Canada) and the Cannabis Regulations (Canada).

The licensee has failed to ensure that the written policy related to storage of recreational cannabis, was complied with.

In accordance with O. Reg 246/22 s. 11 (1) (b), the licensee is required to ensure that written policies and protocols were developed for the storage of recreational cannabis, and ensure they were complied with.

Specifically, on a specific day in September, a resident reported their cannabis went missing, however it later appeared within their room. Interviews with staff confirm that the resident does not always use the lock box provided in their room, as required within the Resident Use of Recreational Cannabis Policy #SM-1.22.
