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The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Complaint inspection.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with the Administrator, the Director of Care, the Assistant Director of Care, Registered staff and Personal Support Workers.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) reviewed clinical records, observed resident care, interviewed staff, and reviewed policies and procedures related to L-001203-12.

The following Inspection Protocols were used during this inspection: **Continence Care and Bowel Management**

Findings of Non-Compliance were found during this inspection.

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Non-compliance with requirements under the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007 (LTCHA) was found. (A requirement under the the definition of "requirement under this Act" in subsection 2(1) of the LTCHA.)

The following constitutes written notification of non-compliance under paragraph 1 of section 152 of the LTCHA.

WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 51. Continence care and bowel management Specifically failed to comply with the following subsections:

s. 51. (2) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that,

- (a) each resident who is incontinent receives an assessment that includes identification of causal factors, patterns, type of incontinence and potential to restore function with specific interventions, and that where the condition or circumstances of the resident require, an assessment is conducted using a clinically appropriate assessment instrument that is specifically designed for assessment of incontinence;
- (b) each resident who is incontinent has an individualized plan, as part of his or her plan of care, to promote and manage bowel and bladder continence based on the assessment and that the plan is implemented;
- (c) each resident who is unable to toilet independently some or all of the time receives assistance from staff to manage and maintain continence;
- (d) each resident who is incontinent and has been assessed as being potentially continent or continent some of the time receives the assistance and support from staff to become continent or continent some of the time;
- (e) continence care products are not used as an alternative to providing assistance to a person to tollet;
- (f) there are a range of continence care products available and accessible to residents and staff at all times, and in sufficient quantities for all required changes;
- (a) residents who require continence care products have sufficient changes to remain clean, dry and comfortable: and
- (h) residents are provided with a range of continence care products that,
- (i) are based on their individual assessed needs,
- (ii) properly fit the residents,
- (iii) promote resident comfort, ease of use, dignity and good skin integrity,
- (iv) promote continued independence wherever possible, and
- (v) are appropriate for the time of day, and for the individual resident's type of incontinence. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 51 (2).

Findings/Faits saillants:

- 1. Five resident plans of care were reviewed. Four out of five residents who may have benefited from an individualized care plan for toileting, did not have one.
- Staff confirm that all residents are toileted before and after meals and at bedtime.[O.Reg 79/10, s.51(2)(b)]
- 2. Five residents who are at least occasionally incontinent were reviewed. Four out of five of these residents did not have an assessment that identified causal factors, type of incontinence and specific interventions.
- Two out of five of the residents had potential to be more continent but had not been assessed using a clinically appropriate assessment tool designed to assess incontinence.
- Management confirms that the Home has not completed continence assessments on each resident who is incontinent. [O.Reg 79/10,s.51(2)(a)]



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Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that every resident who is incontinent receives an assessment that includes identification of causal factors, patterns, types of incontinence and potential to restore function with specific interventions, and that where the condition of the resident require, an assessment is conducted using a clinically appropriate assessment instrument that is specifically designed for assessment of incontinence, to be implemented voluntarily.
