Inspection Summary/Résumé de l'inspection



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The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Critical Incident System inspection.

This inspection was conducted on the following date(s): January 20-22, 25-29, 2021, February 2-4, 2021.

The following intakes were completed in this critical incident inspection: Log #: 020092-20/CIS#2702-000028-20 was related to a missing/unaccounted for Controlled Substance.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with the Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Director of Care (DOC), Unit Manager, Infection Prevention and Control Lead, Housekeepers, Registered Nurses (RNs), Registered Practical Nurses (RPNs), and Personal Support Workers (PSWs).

During the course of the inspection, the inspector observed residents, the care they received, and their home environment, observed housekeeping services, infection prevention and control practices, reviewed clinical health records, relevant home policies and procedures, and other pertinent documents.

WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 229. Infection prevention and control program

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 229. (9) The licensee shall ensure that there is in place a hand hygiene program in accordance with evidence-based practices and, if there are none, in accordance with prevailing practices, and with access to point-of-care hand hygiene agents. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 229 (9).

Findings/Faits saillants:



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1. The licensee has failed to ensure that there is a hand-hygiene program in accordance with evidence-based practices and, if there are none, in accordance with prevailing practices, and with access to point-of-care hand hygiene agents.

During the inspection period, hand hygiene agents were not available in residents' rooms. Wall mounted dispensers for Purell alcohol based hand rub (ABHR) were observed at residents' bedsides, but the dispensers were empty. In response to shortages of ABHR during the pandemic, the licensee left the dispensers in the residents' rooms unfilled and directed staff to clean their hands using soap and water in residents' washrooms or with ABHR from the wall mounted dispensers in the hallways.

The home's Hand Hygiene policy was reviewed, and it did not include access to point of care hand hygiene agents as part of the home's Hand Hygiene program.

Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that there is a hand-hygiene program in accordance with evidence-based practices and, if there are none, in accordance with prevailing practices, and with access to point-of-care hand hygiene agents, to be implemented voluntarily.
