The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Complaint inspection.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with the Administrator, Acting Director of Care, Registered Practical Nurse, Personal Support Workers, Laundry Aide and Residents.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) reviewed the clinical records of 16 residents, observed resident rooms and spa rooms, observed dining service and observed staff-resident interactions related to L-001554-12.

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Non-compliance with requirements under the Long-Term Care the definition of "requirement under this Act" in subsection 2(1) of the LTCHA.)

The following constitutes written notification of non-compliance under paragraph 1 of section 152 of the LTCHA.

WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 89. Laundry service Specifically failed to comply with the following subsections:

- s. 89. (1) As part of the organized program of laundry services under clause 15 (1) (b) of the Act, every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that,
- (a) procedures are developed and implemented to ensure that,
- (i) residents' linens are changed at least once a week and more often as needed,
- (ii) residents' personal items and clothing are labelled in a dignified manner within 48 hours of admission and of acquiring, in the case of new clothing.
- (iii) residents' soiled clothes are collected, sorted, cleaned and delivered to the resident, and
- (iv) there is a process to report and locate residents' lost clothing and personal items;
- (b) a sufficient supply of clean linen, face cloths and bath towels are always available in the home for use by residents;
- (c) linen, face cloths and bath towels are kept clean and sanitary and are maintained in a good state of repair, free from stains and odours; and
- (d) industrial washers and dryers are used for the washing and drying of all laundry. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 89 (1).

Findings/Faits saillants:

1. During a walk-through of the resident home area, one linen cart was observed to have no hand-towels, no bath-towels and only five face-cloths on the cart available for resident use. Resident rooms did not contain face-cloths or handtowels. The spa room did have approximately 5 towels in it.

The other linen cart had 11 bath-towels and several face-cloths. There were ample sheets and bedspreads on both carts. The spa room had six bath-towels, four hand-towels and no facecloths.

Resident rooms observed on that side did not have face-cloths or hand-towels available to the residents.

Staff confirmed that there were no hand-towels or face-cloths available for residents and also stated that they occasionally run out of linen - mostly towels and facecloths. [O.Reg.79/10 s.89(1)(b)]

Some of the linens were observed to be yellowed and several towels were observed to be tattered and worn along the
