(a) symptoms indicating the presence of infection in residents are monitored in accordance with any standard or protocol issued by the Director under subsection (2);
and

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The home experienced infectious disease outbreaks and staff were required to monitor infectious symptoms every shift for the affected residents. Two affected residents were not monitored on certain shifts during this period.
