WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Safe Lifts and Transfers

NC #001 Written Notification pursuant to FLTCA, 2021, s. 154 (1) 1. Non-compliance with: O. Reg. 246/22, s. 40

Transferring and positioning techniques

s. 40. Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that staff use safe transferring and positioning devices or techniques when assisting residents.

The licensee has failed to ensure that staff transferred a resident using safe techniques, as the device was improperly positioned prior to the transfer taking place. As a result of the improper transfer, the resident fell and sustained an injury.

WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Drug Destruction and Disposal

NC #002 Written Notification pursuant to FLTCA, 2021, s. 154 (1) 1.

Non-compliance with: O. Reg. 246/22, s. 148 (2) 4.

Drug destruction and disposal

s. 148 (2) The drug destruction and disposal policy must also provide for the following:

4. That drugs that are to be destroyed are destroyed in accordance with subsection (3). O. Reg. 246/22, s. 148 (2).

The licensee has failed to ensure that staff properly disposed of a controlled substance, when resident declined to take the medication.
