Inspection Summary/Résumé de l'inspection

The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Critical Incident System inspection.

This inspection was conducted on the following date(s): offsite on May 15, 20, 21 and 22, 2020.

The following intake was included in this inspection:

Log #004438-20\AH: IL-75267-AH/Critical Intake (CI) #3004-000001-20 related to skin and wound assessments.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with the Executive Director (ED), Director of Care (DOC), a Registered Nurse (RN), Registered Practical Nurses (RPNs), Wound Care lead.

The inspector also reviewed relevant clinical documentation which included but was not limited to assessments, progress notes, plan of care, and electronic treatment records (eTAR).

Non-compliance with requirements under the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007 (LTCHA) was found. (a requirement under the LTCHA includes the requirements contained in the items listed in the definition of "requirement under this Act" in subsection 2(1) of the LTCHA).

The following constitutes written notification of non-compliance under paragraph 1 of section 152 of the LTCHA.

Ce qui suit constitue un avis écrit de non-respect aux termes du paragraphe 1 de l'article 152 de la LFSLD.

WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 50. Skin and wound care

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

**s. 50. (2) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that,
(a) a resident at risk of altered skin integrity receives a skin assessment by a
member of the registered nursing staff,
(i) within 24 hours of the resident's admission,
(ii) upon any return of the resident from hospital, and
(iii) upon any return of the resident from an absence of greater than 24 hours; O.
Reg. 79/10, s. 50 (2).**

Findings/Faits saillants :

1. The licensee has failed to ensure that a resident exhibiting altered skin integrity received a skin assessment by a member of the registered nursing staff upon any return from hospital.

a) Resident #001 was assessed as at moderate risk for altered skin integrity.

Resident #001 was admitted to hospital for a fall with injury and was readmitted to the home seven days later.

A Head to Toe assessment upon readmission to the home documented two areas of impaired skin integrity.

There were no documented skin and wound assessments completed until three days following the resident's readmission to the home.

Skin and Wound lead/RPN #104 stated they were alerted by a PSW, that resident #001 had additional areas of impaired skin integrity. The resident was assessed to have a stage III wound and a surgical wound. The sites were cleansed and dressings were applied. The treatment plan was updated at this time.

2. b) Resident #003 was assessed as at mild risk for altered skin integrity.

The clinical record for resident #003 also showed the resident had two pre-existing areas of altered skin integrity.

Resident #003 had a hospital stay and upon their return to the home, their clinical record

showed a Head to Toe assessment was completed, which identified one pre-existing area of altered skin integrity, a surgical incision and various bruises on the resident.

There was no skin and wound assessment documented until nine days following the resident's readmission to the home.

RPN #105 and #106 said their responsibility when a resident returned from hospital was to complete a Head to Toe assessment and pain assessment within six hours. If there were any skin or wound issues a skin and wound assessment would be done. RPN #106 and Skin and Wound lead #104 acknowledged they had not completed a skin and wound assessment upon the resident's return from hospital.

The licensee failed to ensure that resident #001 and #003, who exhibited altered skin integrity, received a skin assessment by a member of the registered nursing staff upon return from hospital.

 - (i) within 24 hours of the resident's admission,
 - (ii) upon any return of the resident from hospital, and
 - (iii) upon any return of the resident from an absence of greater than 24 hours;
- (b) a resident exhibiting altered skin integrity, including skin breakdown, pressure ulcers, skin tears or wounds,
 - (i) receives a skin assessment by a member of the registered nursing staff, using a clinically appropriate assessment instrument that is specifically designed for skin and wound assessment,
 - (ii) receives immediate treatment and interventions to reduce or relieve pain, promote healing, and prevent infection, as required,
 - (iii) is assessed by a registered dietitian who is a member of the staff of the home, and any changes made to the resident's plan of care relating to nutrition and hydration are implemented, and
 - (iv) is reassessed at least weekly by a member of the registered nursing staff, if clinically indicated;
- (c) the equipment, supplies, devices and positioning aids referred to in subsection (1) are readily available at the home as required to relieve pressure, treat pressure ulcers, skin tears or wounds and promote healing; and
- (d) any resident who is dependent on staff for repositioning is repositioned every two hours or more frequently as required depending upon the resident's condition and tolerance of tissue load, except that a resident shall only be repositioned while asleep if clinically indicated. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 50 (2).

The licensee must be compliant with O. Reg. 50. (2) (a) (ii).

Specifically, the licensee must ensure that:

- a. When a resident that is at risk of altered skin integrity, returns from hospital they receive a skin assessment by a member of the registered nursing staff, using a clinically appropriate assessment instrument that is specifically designed for skin and wound assessment.
- b. A monthly audit of skin and wound assessments is completed for residents that have returned from hospital. The audit must include at a minimum the name of the person completing the audits, the date, outcome, and actions taken to address the outcome if required. Records of these audits should be kept in the home.

Grounds / Motifs :

1. 1. The licensee has failed to ensure that a resident exhibiting altered skin integrity received a skin assessment by a member of the registered nursing staff upon any return from hospital.
 - a) Resident #001 was assessed as at moderate risk for altered skin integrity.

Resident #001 was admitted to hospital for a fall with injury and was readmitted to the home seven days later.

A Head to Toe assessment upon readmission to the home documented two areas of impaired skin integrity.

There were no documented skin and wound assessments completed until three days following the resident's readmission to the home.

Skin and Wound lead/RPN #104 stated they were alerted by a PSW, that resident #001 had additional areas of impaired skin integrity. The resident was assessed to have a stage III wound and a surgical wound. The sites were cleansed and dressings were applied. The treatment plan was updated at this time.

2. 2. b) Resident #003 was assessed as at mild risk for altered skin integrity.

The clinical record for resident #003 also showed the resident had two pre-existing areas of altered skin integrity.

Resident #003 had a hospital stay and upon their return to the home, their clinical record showed a Head to Toe assessment was completed, which identified one pre-existing area of altered skin integrity, a surgical incision and various bruises on the resident.

There was no skin and wound assessment documented until nine days following the resident's readmission to the home.

RPN #105 and #106 said their responsibility when a resident returned from hospital was to complete a Head to Toe assessment and pain assessment within six hours. If there were any skin or wound issues a skin and wound assessment would be done. RPN #106 and Skin and Wound lead #104 acknowledged they had not completed a skin and wound assessment upon the resident's return from hospital.

The licensee failed to ensure that resident #001 and #003, who exhibited altered skin integrity, received a skin assessment by a member of the registered nursing staff upon return from hospital.

The severity of this issue was minimal harm or minimal risk. The scope of the issue was a pattern with two of three residents reviewed, not receiving a skin and wound assessment following return from hospital. The compliance history is a level three, as there were previous incidents of non compliance to the same subsection in the last 36 months. During inspection 2019_792659_0011, dated June 20, 2019 a written notification and a compliance order was issued. During inspection 2018_750539_0004, dated August 14, 2018, a voluntary plan of correction was issued. (659)

If the Licensee is not served with written notice of the Director's decision within 28 days of receipt of the Licensee's request for review, this(these) Order(s) is(are) deemed to be confirmed by the Director and the Licensee is deemed to have been served with a copy of that decision on the expiry of the 28 day period.

The Licensee has the right to appeal the Director's decision on a request for review of an Inspector's Order(s) to the Health Services Appeal and Review Board (HSARB) in accordance with section 164 of the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007. The HSARB is an independent tribunal not connected with the Ministry. They are established by legislation to review matters concerning health care services. If the Licensee decides to request a hearing, the Licensee must, within 28 days of being served with the notice of the Director's decision, give a written notice of appeal to both:
