Inspection Summary/Résumé de l'inspection



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The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Resident Quality Inspection inspection.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with the Executive Director/Director of Care, Environmental Services Manager, Dietary Manager, Recreation Manager, Business Manager, RAI Co-ordinator, 2 Registered Practical Nurses, 3 Personal Support Workers, 40 plus Residents and 4 Family Members.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) observed resident and staff interactions, toured resident home areas, interviewed residents, families and staff, reviewed resident's clinical records, observed dining and medication, internal investigative reports and relevant policies and procedures.

WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 73. Dining and snack service

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 73. (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the home has a dining and snack service that includes, at a minimum, the following elements:
- 5. A process to ensure that food service workers and other staff assisting residents are aware of the residents' diets, special needs and preferences. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 73 (1).

Findings/Faits saillants:



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1. The licensee has failed to ensure that there was a process in place to ensure that food service workers and other staff assisting residents were aware of the residents' diets, special needs and preferences, as evidenced by:

During a dining observation in October 2014 it was noted that although a dietary roster was used, the food service workers and other staff did not have access to resident's food preferences.

Three Dietary staff as well as the Dietary Manager indicated that the system was changed recently and food preferences for residents were no longer available for staff to use during dining service. [s. 73. (1) 5.]

Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that there is a process in place to ensure that food service workers and other staff assisting residents are aware of the residents' diets, special needs and preferences, to be implemented voluntarily.

WN #2: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 15. Accommodation services

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 15. (2) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that,
- (a) the home, furnishings and equipment are kept clean and sanitary; 2007, c. 8, s. 15 (2).
- (b) each resident's linen and personal clothing is collected, sorted, cleaned and delivered; and 2007, c. 8, s. 15 (2).
- (c) the home, furnishings and equipment are maintained in a safe condition and in a good state of repair. 2007, c. 8, s. 15 (2).

Findings/Faits saillants:



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1. The licensee has failed to ensure that the home, its furnishings and equipment were kept clean and sanitary, as evidenced by:

Observations of the dining room in October 2014 revealed a build up of black dirt on the dining room floor.

A Housekeeping aide indicated that the floor was cleaned three times daily but the build up of dirt doesn't come off with the daily cleaning.

Both the Dietary and Environmental Services Manager acknowledged that the dining room floor had a build up of dirt/wax on it and agreed it was not kept as clean as the rest of the building. The Environmental Services Manager indicated that the frequency of stripping the dining room floor needed to be increased. [s. 15. (2) (a)]
