Inspection Summary/Résumé de l'inspection



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The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Complaint inspection.

This inspection was conducted on the following date(s): October 28, 29, and 30, 2019

The inspector inspected complaint log #018046-19 related to RN staffing in the home and a resident fall.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with Administrator, Director of Care (DOC), Nursing Administration Services Manager (NASM), Registered Nurse (RN) and Registered Practical Nurse (RPN).

The inspector reviewed, RN staffing plan, back up plan, sick calls sheets, managers on call rotations, clinical health records of identified resident and falls assessments.

WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 8. Nursing and personal support services

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 8. (3) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that at least one registered nurse who is both an employee of the licensee and a member of the regular nursing staff of the home is on duty and present in the home at all times, except as provided for in the regulations. 2007, c. 8, s. 8 (3).

Findings/Faits saillants :



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1. The licensee failed to ensure that there was at least one registered nurse who is an employee of the licensee and a member of the regular nursing staff on duty and present at all times, unless there is an allowable exception to this requirement.

Under LTCHA, s. 8(3) for RN in the home at all times, the exceptions would apply under O. Reg 79/10 s. 45(1) for homes with a licensed bed capacity of more than 64 bed and fewer than 129,

i) in the case of a planned or extended leave of absence of an employee of the licensee who is a registered nurse and a member of the regular nursing staff, a registered nurse who works at the home pursuant to a contract or agreement with the licensee and who is a member of the regular nursing staff may be used,

ii) in the case of an emergency where the back-up plan referred to in clause 31(3)(d) of this Regulation fails to ensure that the requirement under subsection 8(3) of the Act is met, a registered nurse who works a the home pursuant to a contract or agreement between the licensee and an employment agency or other third party may be used if, A. the Director of Nursing and Personal Care or a registered nurse who is both an employee of the licensee and member of the regular nursing staff is available by telephone, and

B. a registered practical nurse who is both an employee of the licensee and member of the regular nursing staff is on duty and present in the home.

Related to log #018046-19:

On an identified date the Director received an anonymous complaint, related to not having registered nurses available and on duty in the home during specific periods.

During entrance conference with Inspector #194 related to RN staffing in the home, the Administrator indicated that the RN staffing plan at the home, had one full-time position which was unfilled, since an identified date. The RN position is expected to be filled, on an identified date. Administrator also indicated during interview with Inspector #194 that a casual, part-time RN was currently being offered a position at the home. The Administrator indicated that recruitment of RN staff has been taking place.

During inspection of the complaint, Inspector #194 reviewed the home staffing plan, back plan and Registered Nurses and Registered Practical Nurses scheduled shifts, and the following was indicated:

-On specific dates, full shifts were identified, where there were no registered nurse on



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duty and present in the home.

The licensee failed to ensure that there was at least one registered nurse who is an employee of the licensee and a member of the regular nursing staff on duty and present at all times, unless there is an allowable exception to this requirement, on several identified dates. [s. 8. (3)]

Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance by ensuring that at least one registered nurse who is both an employee of the licensee and a member of the regular nursing staff of the home is on duty and present in the home at all times., to be implemented voluntarily.
