Drug destruction and disposal

- s. 148 (2) The drug destruction and disposal policy must also provide for the following:
- 2. That any controlled substance that is to be destroyed and disposed of shall be stored in a double-locked storage area within the home, separate from any controlled substance that is available for administration to a resident, until the destruction and disposal occurs.

The licensee has failed to ensure that any controlled substance that is to be destroyed and disposed of shall be stored in a double-locked storage area within the home, separate from any controlled substance that is available for administration to a resident, until the destruction and disposal occurs.

In accordance with O. Reg. 246/22, s. 11 (1) (b), the licensee is required to ensure that the drug destruction and disposal policy in place for controlled substances is complied with.

During the home's narcotic destruction procedure, it was discovered that a number of vials of a controlled substance were unaccounted for. As per the licensee's medication management policy, specifically related to Surplus and Discontinued Medication, all narcotic and controlled drugs are to be stored securely under double lock until destroyed. The vials of the controlled substance, however, were removed from the narcotic destruction box prior to being destroyed.
