WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 3. Residents' Bill of Rights

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 3. (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the following rights of residents are fully respected and promoted:

1. Every resident has the right to be treated with courtesy and respect and in a way that fully recognizes the resident's individuality and respects the resident's dignity. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).

Findings/Faits saillants :



Ontario

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1. The licensee of the long term care home failed to ensure that every resident has the right to be treated with courtesy and respect and in a way that fully recognizes the resident's individuality and respects the resident's dignity.

In June 2014, two Personal Support Workers were attempting to get resident #001 up and provide morning care.

During the morning care one Personal Support Worker was heard using inappropriate voice level, tone and words which was directed at the resident. The resident was heard from outside of their room asking the Personal Support Worker to stop.

This was verified by the Personal Support Workers who reported that the resident was not listening to them and they were trying to get the resident up otherwise they would be in bed all day if they did not try and make a routine.

Resident #001 was not treated with courtesy and respect and in a way that fully recognized the resident's individuality and respected the resident's dignity. [s. 3. (1) 1.]

WN #2: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 6. Plan of care

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 6. (2) The licensee shall ensure that the care set out in the plan of care is based on an assessment of the resident and the needs and preferences of that resident. 2007, c. 8, s. 6 (2).

Findings/Faits saillants :





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1. The licensee failed to ensure that the care set out in the plan of care was based on an assessment of the resident and the needs and preferences of that resident.

An assessment for resident #002 indicated the resident had behaviours related to wandering. The resident's plan of care related to mobility indicated the resident was dependent on one staff for mobility.

In August 2014, resident #002 was taken to the dining room by a Personal Support Worker. Approximately, 15 minutes later the resident was found by staff in another resident's room.

The Director of Care verified that resident #002's plan of care was not based on the behaviour assessment related to the resident's wandering and mobility. [s. 6. (2)]
