# WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Doors in a Home

NC # Written Notification pursuant to FLTCA, 2021, s. 154 (1) 1.

# Non-compliance with: O. Reg. 246/22, s. 12 (1) 3.

Doors in a home

s. 12 (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the following rules are complied with:

3. All doors leading to non-residential areas must be equipped with locks to restrict unsupervised access to those areas by residents, and those doors must be kept closed and locked when they are not being supervised by staff.

The licensee has failed to ensure that doors to non-residential rooms were kept closed and locked when they were not supervised by staff.

# **Rationale and Summary**

There were multiple observations of doors to non-residential rooms being kept



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open and unsupervised by staff.

The Environmental Services Manager and the Administrator stated that for the safety of residents, doors to non-residential rooms must be locked when unsupervised.

The home's failure to ensure that doors to non-residential rooms remained locked when not supervised by staff was a low risk of harm to residents.
