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**Inspection Summary/Résumé de l'inspection**

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The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Follow up inspection.

This inspection was conducted on the following date(s): October 6, 2016

An inspection (2015-338147-0009) was previously conducted April 20 to May 4, 2015 at which time an Order (#004) was issued related to insufficient illumination levels in various areas throughout the home. Non compliance with respect to illumination levels was also identified during an inspection conducted in April 2013 at which time a Voluntary Plan of Compliance was issued.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with the Administrator.

Non-compliance with requirements under the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007 (LTCHA) was found. (a requirement under the LTCHA includes the requirements contained in the items listed in the definition of "requirement under this Act" in subsection 2(1) of the LTCHA).

The following constitutes written notification of non-compliance under paragraph 1 of section 152 of the LTCHA.

1. The licensee did not ensure that the lighting requirements set out in the lighting table were maintained.

The home was built prior to 2009 and therefore the section of the lighting table that was applied is titled "All other Homes". Non compliance related to illumination levels in stairwells, corridors, resident bedrooms and shower areas was previously identified during an inspection completed in April 2013. Not all areas could be measured due to natural light infiltration and the licensee was therefore advised to take their own measurements during night time or evening conditions when natural light sources would not affect the readings. An Order was subsequently issued for the licensee to establish a



plan which included what areas of the home required illumination upgrades to meet the minimum regulatory requirements and the plan was to be implemented.

A hand held light meter was used (Sekonic Handi Lumi) to measure the lux levels in various areas. The meter was held a standard 30 inches above and parallel to the floor. All efforts were made to eliminate natural light sources by closing blinds or curtains and to allow all artificial sources of light to warm up for a few minutes before testing.

During this inspection, confirmation was made that resident bedrooms, all corridors and resident washrooms (with the exception of 4) met the minimum illumination requirements. However, the third floor shower room, which was previously identified on May 4, 2015 as being under illuminated was not included in any lighting upgrades. The level of illumination was 50 lux at the toilet, 150 lux at the vanity, 100 lux upon entry and 50 lux in front of the shower area. The second floor shower room was less than 100 lux upon entry, where a light fixture was noted to be burnt out. The minimum required illumination level is 215.28 lux.

The main floor dining room could not be previously measured due to sunny outdoor conditions which affected the levels that needed to be acquired from artificial sources of light. During this inspection, the conditions outdoors were overcast and the blinds were partially drawn in the room. The room was observed to have numerous chandeliers throughout the space, however the majority of the chandeliers had at least one or two light bulbs burnt out for a total of 22 burnt out bulbs. The level of illumination was affected in part due to the burnt out bulbs, but also in part due to the type of light bulb provided (incandescent bulbs). When measured under two different chandeliers, one was 190 lux with three light bulbs burnt out and one was 175 lux with one light bulb burnt out. Based on the values acquired from the two chandeliers, and the fact that all the chandeliers had the same type and number of light bulbs, the entire room is therefore presumed to be insufficient in meeting the minimum illumination level of 215.28 lux.
