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WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 8. Nursing and personal support services

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 8. (3) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that at least one registered nurse who is both an employee of the licensee and a member of the regular nursing staff of the home is on duty and present in the home at all times, except as provided for in the regulations. 2007, c. 8, s. 8 (3).

Findings/Faits saillants :

1. The licensee failed to ensure that at least one registered nurse (RN) who was an employee of the licensee and a member of the regular nursing staff was on duty and present at all times unless there was an allowable exception to this requirement (see definition/description for list of exceptions as stated in section 45. (1) and 45.1 of the Regulation).

Upper Canada Lodge has a licensed capacity of 80 beds and did not qualify for any exceptions as specified in the regulations. During this complaint inspection, log #013597-19, it was identified that during two identified months, there was a total of 24 occasions when the home did not have a proper RN replacement.

A review of the RN schedules for an identified 27 week period of time, identified that the home utilized contracted agency RN's to cover 27 vacant shifts.

This information was reviewed by the Director of Resident Care, who confirmed that the need to fill the RN shift was not a result of an emergency situation as outlined in O. Reg 79/10, s. 45(2) and that the contracted agency RN was not an employee of the licensee or a member of the regular nursing staff of the home. [s. 8. (3)]



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Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that at least one registered nurse (RN) who is an employee of the licensee and a member of the regular nursing staff is on duty and present at all times unless there is an allowable exception to this requirement (see definition/description for list of exceptions as stated in section 45. (1) and 45.1 of the Regulation), to be implemented voluntarily.
