Non-Compliance Remedied

The licensee has failed to ensure that the controlled substances are stored in a double locked stationary cupboard.

Rationale and Summary

An inspector observed the controlled substances box was not stationary and was sitting on top of the vaccine fridge in the charge nurse office.

The DOC stated it was not stationary and it should have been.

An inspector was notified by the DOC that the controlled substances box was now stationary to the wall in the charge nurse office.

An Inspector observed the box securely fastened and stationary on the wall.
