Non-compliance with: O. Reg. 246/22, s. 12 (1) 3.

Doors in a home

- s. 12 (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the following rules are complied with:
- 3. All doors leading to non-residential areas must be equipped with locks to restrict unsupervised access to those areas by residents, and those doors must be kept closed and locked when they are not being supervised by staff.

The licensee has failed to ensure that the rule to keep all doors leading to non-residential areas closed and locked when not being supervised, was compled with.

During the inspection, a servery room door, a garbage chute room door, and several utility room doors were not latching or were being locked by staff.
