WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Authorization for an admission to a home NC #01 Written Notification pursuant to FLTCA, 2021, s. 154 (1) 1. Non-compliance with: FLTCA, 2021, s. 51 (7)

The licensee has failed to approve an applicant's admission to the home unless: the home lacked the physical facilities necessary to meet the applicant's care requirements; the staff of the home lacked the nursing expertise necessary to meet the applicant's care requirements; or circumstances existed which were provided for in the regulations as being grounds for withholding approval.

Rationale and Summary



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An applicant had been approved to the Long-Term Care Homes (LTCHs) waitlist for admission. After the LTCH reviewed updated documents provided by Home and Community Care Support Services North East (HCCSSNE), the LTCH withdrew their approval for admission. The rationale for the applicant's refusal for admission to the home indicated that the staff lacked the nursing expertise necessary to meet the applicant's care requirements.

The applicant's application and behavioural assessments identified that they had a history of specified responsive behaviours.

The Executive Director (ED) indicated that they believed the applicant's responsive behaviours would be disruptive, and that staff were not trained on the applicant's specified behaviours, which could cause a risk to the safety of the other residents.

There was moderate impact and moderate risk to the applicant for the LTCH withholding their approval for admission.
