WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 129. Safe storage of drugs



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Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 129. (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that,
- (a) drugs are stored in an area or a medication cart,
 - (i) that is used exclusively for drugs and drug-related supplies,
 - (ii) that is secure and locked,
- (iii) that protects the drugs from heat, light, humidity or other environmental conditions in order to maintain efficacy, and
- (iv) that complies with manufacturer's instructions for the storage of the drugs; and O. Reg. 79/10, s. 129 (1).
- (b) controlled substances are stored in a separate, double-locked stationary cupboard in the locked area or stored in a separate locked area within the locked medication cart. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 129 (1).

Findings/Faits saillants:



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1. The licensee failed to ensure that drugs are stored in an a medication cart that is used exclusively for drugs and drug-related supplies.

During the medication administration on a specified date the following observations were made:

- Lower denture plate belonging to an identified resident, veterans affairs card, Rewards points card and money stored within the medication cart on an identified unit
- Several monetary gift cards for staff were stored in an identified medication cart
- Two watches and money were stored in an identified medication cart
- Interviews held with Registered staff members confirmed that not all staff were aware that items other than drugs should not be stored within medication carts [s. 129. (1) (a)].
- 2. The following requirement was found to be in non compliance on February 29, 2012 and during this inspection.

The licensee failed to ensure that controlled substances are stored in a separate, double-locked stationary cupboard in the locked area or stored in a separate locked area within the locked medication cart.

During the medication administration on a specified date the following observation was made:

- Controlled substances for an identified resident were not stored in a separate locked area within a medication cart.
- Interviews with Registered staff members and the Director of Care confirmed that all controlled substances must be scanned into the system and immediately locked in the narcotic bin [s. 129. (1) (b)].



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Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that drugs are stored in an a medication cart that is used exclusively for drugs and drug-related supplies and that controlled substances are stored in a separate, double-locked stationary cupboard in the locked area or stored in a separate locked area within the locked medication cart, to be implemented voluntarily.
