### **WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Air Temperature**

Non-compliance with: O. Reg. 246/22, s. 24 (3)

Air temperature

s. 24 (3) The temperature required to be measured under subsection (2) shall be documented at least once every morning, once every afternoon between 12 p.m. and 5 p.m. and once every evening or night.

The licensee failed to ensure that temperatures in the home were documented every morning, once every afternoon between 12 p.m. and 5 p.m. and once every evening or night.

NC #002 Written Notification pursuant to FLTCA, 2021, s. 154 (1) 1.

Non-compliance with: O. Reg. 246/22, s. 40

Transferring and positioning techniques

s. 40. Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that staff use safe transferring and positioning devices or techniques when assisting residents.



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The licensee failed to ensure that safe repositioning techniques were used by staff when providing care for a resident.
