Inspection Summary/Résumé de l'inspection



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The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Complaint inspection.

This inspection was conducted on the following date(s): March 21, 25, 26, 2013

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with the Administrator/Director of Care, RAI Coordinator, Registered Dietitian, Nutrition Manager, Registered Staff, Food Service Workers, Personal Support Workers, residents

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) interviewed staff and residents, observed food production and meal service, reviewed health records and relevant home policies

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Non-compliance with requirements under the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007 (LTCHA) was found. (A requirement under the LTCHA includes the requirements contained in the items listed in the definition of "requirement under this Act" in subsection 2(1) of the LTCHA.)

The following constitutes written notification of non-compliance under paragraph 1 of section 152 of the LTCHA.

Le non-respect des exigences de la Loi de 2007 sur les foyers de soins de longue durée (LFSLD) a été constaté. (Une exigence de la loi comprend les exigences qui font partie des éléments énumérés dans la définition de « exigence prévue par la présente loi », au paragraphe 2(1) de la LFSLD.

Ce qui suit constitue un avis écrit de non-respect aux termes du paragraphe 1 de l'article 152 de la LFSLD.

WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 75. Nutrition manager

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 75. (2) A person hired as a nutrition manager after the coming into force of this section must be a member of the Canadian Society of Nutrition Management or a registered dietitian. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 75 (2).

Findings/Faits saillants :

1. The home's nutrition manager, hired in the position November 5, 2012, is not an active member of the Canadian Society of Nutrition Management (CSNM) and therefore does not meet the qualifications required for a person hired as a nutrition manager. [s. 75. (2)]

Additional Required Actions:

CO # - 001 will be served on the licensee. Refer to the “Order(s) of the Inspector”.

WN #2: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 6. Plan of care



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Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 6. (7) The licensee shall ensure that the care set out in the plan of care is provided to the resident as specified in the plan. 2007, c. 8, s. 6 (7).

Findings/Faits saillants :

1. The licensee has not ensured that the care set out in the plan of care has been provided to identified residents.

Resident #001 was served a broccoli salad, which was identified as a dislike for the resident. Resident did not eat the menu item and dietary aide confirmed that the resident's preferences were not checked prior to serving.

Registered Dietitian wrote an order to provide Resident #001 with one chocolate ensure plus daily on February 13, 2013. Resident did not receive the nutritional supplement February 13,14,15,16,17, 2013. [s. 6. (7)]

2. Resident #002, on a modified diabetic renal diet, was offered restricted food items at observed lunch meal March 21, 2013. [s. 6. (7)]
3. Resource 2.0 90 mLs by mouth when less than 50% meal consumed was ordered for resident #004 on January 23, 2013. Documentation reviewed indicated that resident consumed less than 50% of a meal on March 1,2,5,12,13,15,17, 2013. Progress notes and electronic Medication Administration Record did not reflect provision of the resource as prescribed. Staff interviews revealed lack of awareness that resource was ordered for the resident when less than 50% meal consumed. [s. 6. (7)]

Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that the care set out in the plan of care has been provided to identified residents, to be implemented voluntarily.

WN #3: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 71. Menu planning



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Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 71. (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the home's menu cycle,
(b) includes menus for regular, therapeutic and texture modified diets for both meals and snacks; O. Reg. 79/10, s. 71 (1).

s. 71. (5) The licensee shall ensure that an individualized menu is developed for each resident whose needs cannot be met through the home's menu cycle.
O. Reg. 79/10, s. 71 (5).

Findings/Faits saillants :

1. The licensee has not ensured that the home's menu cycle includes menus for therapeutic, and texture modified diets for both meals and snacks. [s. 71. (1) (b)]
2. The licensee failed to ensure that an individualized menu has been developed for resident #002 related to renal therapeutic diet needs. [s. 71. (5)]

Additional Required Actions:

*VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2)
the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for
achieving compliance to ensure that the home's menu cycle includes menus for
therapeutic and texture modified diets for both meals and snacks, to be
implemented voluntarily.*

WN #4: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 72. Food production

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 72. (2) The food production system must, at a minimum, provide for,
(c) standardized recipes and production sheets for all menus; O. Reg. 79/10, s. 72 (2).

Findings/Faits saillants :



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-
1. The licensee has not ensured that standardized recipes and production sheets are in place for all menus.

Standardized recipes and production sheets are not in place for all menus including regular, modified diabetic, modified diabetic renal, and for textures including regular, minced, and pureed. Because the system is not in place, there is no way to ensure that taste, nutritive value, appearance, and food quality are preserved.

During dinner meal production observation on March 21, 2013, there were no production sheets/recipes in place for all menus.

On March 25, 2013, lunch meal production, there were only standardized recipes in place for regular textured menu items. There was no direction in place for other therapeutics and texture modified menus. [s. 72. (2) (c)]

Additional Required Actions:

***VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2)
the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for
achieving compliance to ensure that standardized recipes and production
sheets are in place for all menus, to be implemented voluntarily.***

WN #5: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 73. Dining and snack service

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 73. (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the home has a dining and snack service that includes, at a minimum, the following elements:

5. A process to ensure that food service workers and other staff assisting residents are aware of the residents' diets, special needs and preferences. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 73 (1).

Findings/Faits saillants :



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-
1. The licensee has not ensured that the home's dining and snack service includes a process to ensure that food service workers and other staff assisting residents are aware of the residents' diets (menu items and portions) as the menu cycle does not include menus for therapeutic, and texture modified diets for both meals and snacks. Inconsistencies in portions served was noted between dining rooms over the course of the inspection. [s. 73. (1) 5.]

Additional Required Actions:

***VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2)
the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for
achieving compliance to ensure that the home's dining and snack service
includes a process to ensure that food service workers and other staff assisting
residents are aware of the residents' diets, to be implemented voluntarily.***

**WN #6: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 26. Plan of care
Specifically failed to comply with the following:**

- s. 26. (4) The licensee shall ensure that a registered dietitian who is a member of the staff of the home,**
(a) completes a nutritional assessment for all residents on admission and whenever there is a significant change in a resident's health condition; and O. Reg. 79/10, s. 26 (4).
(b) assesses the matters referred to in paragraphs 13 and 14 of subsection (3). O. Reg. 79/10, s. 26 (4).

Findings/Faits saillants :

1. The licensee did not ensure that the registered dietitian completed a nutritional assessment for resident #004 related to significant weight loss:
There is no assessment of significant weight change in November 2012 or February 2013 by the home's registered dietitian.
Resident #004 lost 6.4% body weight between October 3, 2012 and November 5, 2012.
Resident #004 lost 12.1 % body weight between August 3, 2012 and February 1, 2013. [s. 26. (4)]



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WN #7: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 68. Nutrition care and hydration programs

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 68. (2) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the programs include,

(a) the development and implementation, in consultation with a registered dietitian who is a member of the staff of the home, of policies and procedures relating to nutrition care and dietary services and hydration; O. Reg. 79/10, s. 68 (2).

(b) the identification of any risks related to nutrition care and dietary services and hydration; O. Reg. 79/10, s. 68 (2).

(c) the implementation of interventions to mitigate and manage those risks; O. Reg. 79/10, s. 68 (2).

(d) a system to monitor and evaluate the food and fluid intake of residents with identified risks related to nutrition and hydration; and O. Reg. 79/10, s. 68 (2).

(e) a weight monitoring system to measure and record with respect to each resident,

(i) weight on admission and monthly thereafter, and

(ii) body mass index and height upon admission and annually thereafter. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 68 (2).

Findings/Faits saillants :

1. The licensee failed to ensure that the following residents were weighed monthly as required.

Resident #001 was not weighed in October 2012.

Resident #004 was not weighed in September 2012. [s. 68. (2) (e)]



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WN #8: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 69. Weight changes

Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that residents with the following weight changes are assessed using an interdisciplinary approach, and that actions are taken and outcomes are evaluated:

- 1. A change of 5 per cent of body weight, or more, over one month.**
- 2. A change of 7.5 per cent of body weight, or more, over three months.**
- 3. A change of 10 per cent of body weight, or more, over 6 months.**
- 4. Any other weight change that compromises the resident's health status. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 69.**

Findings/Faits saillants :

1. The licensee did not ensure that resident #004 with a change of 5 per cent of body weight, or more, over one month was assessed using an interdisciplinary approach, and that actions were taken and outcomes evaluated:

Resident #004 lost 6.4% body weight between October 3, 2012 and November 5, 2012. There was no interdisciplinary assessment of the resident's weight loss at that time. The resident continued to lose weight up until March 2013. [s. 69.]

WN #9: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 131.

Administration of drugs

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 131. (3) Subject to subsections (4) and (5), the licensee shall ensure that no person administers a drug to a resident in the home unless that person is a physician, dentist, registered nurse or a registered practical nurse. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 131 (3).

Findings/Faits saillants :

1. An identified Personal Support Worker was observed to administer medications to resident #004 at lunch meal on March 26, 2013. The medications were placed into the resident's lunch meal and fed to the resident by the PSW. [s. 131. (3)]

The Licensee has the right to request a review by the Director of this (these) Order(s) and to request that the Director stay this (these) Order(s) in accordance with section 163 of the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007.

The written request for review must include,

If the Licensee is not served with written notice of the Director's decision within 28 days of receipt of the Licensee's request for review, this(these) Order(s) is(are) deemed to be confirmed by the Director and the Licensee is deemed to have been served with a copy of that decision on the expiry of the 28 day period.

The Licensee has the right to appeal the Director's decision on a request for review of an Inspector's Order(s) to the Health Services Appeal and Review Board (HSARB) in accordance with section 164 of the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007. The HSARB is an independent tribunal not connected with the Ministry. They are established by legislation to review matters concerning health care services. If the Licensee decides to request a hearing, the Licensee must, within 28 days of being served with the notice of the Director's decision, give a written notice of appeal to both:
