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The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Complaint inspection.

This inspection was conducted on the following date(s): February 13,2015

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with the Administrator, Director of Care, Registered Nurse, and Personal Support Workers.

During the course of inspection the inspector(s) reviewed the complaint concern, residents clinical records, policies and procedures for abuse, staff education and training on abuse, internal investigation notes, toured the home and observed resident care and services.

The following Inspection Protocols were used during this inspection: Prevention of Abuse, Neglect and Retaliation

WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 53. Responsive behaviours



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#### Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 53. (4) The licensee shall ensure that, for each resident demonstrating responsive behaviours,
- (a) the behavioural triggers for the resident are identified, where possible; O. Reg. 79/10, s. 53 (4).
- (b) strategies are developed and implemented to respond to these behaviours, where possible; and O. Reg. 79/10, s. 53 (4).
- (c) actions are taken to respond to the needs of the resident, including assessments, reassessments and interventions and that the resident's responses to interventions are documented. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 53 (4).

#### Findings/Faits saillants:



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- 1. The licensee failed to ensure that, for each resident demonstrating responsive behaviours, (a) the behavioural triggers for the resident are identified, where possible; (b) strategies are developed and implemented to respond to these behaviours, where possible; and (c) actions are taken to respond to the needs of the resident, including assessments, reassessments and interventions and that the resident's responses to interventions are documented.
- a)Progress notes dating back to Resident admission revealed ongoing concerns with behaviours.
- b)A review of Residents plan of care revealed behavioural triggers, and strategies to respond to the resident's behaviours were absent. The Minimum Data Set (MDS) assessment dated revealed the resident exhibited behaviour daily that was not easily altered.
- c) The plan of care did not include behavioural triggers for the resident's behaviours as identified in the MDS that occur daily and are not easily altered. No documentation in the care plan existed regarding strategies to respond to the identified behaviours.
- d) Personal Support Worker, Registered Practical Nurse, and Director of Care confirmed interventions to respond to the needs of the resident were absent in the plan of care. Personal Support Worker, Director of Care and Registered Nurse confirmed the Kardex is where Personal Support Workers look for care instructions and there were none listed to address the resident's responsive behaviours.

Management confirmed that the homes expectation is that behaviours of this type be part of the plan of care with goals and interventions outlined in the plan of care. [s. 53. (4)]



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#### Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that, for each resident demonstrating responsive behaviours, (a) the behavioural triggers for the resident are identified, where possible; (b) strategies are developed and implemented to respond to these behaviours, where possible; and (c) actions are taken to respond to the needs of the resident, including assessments, reassessments and interventions and that the resident's responses to interventions are documented., to be implemented voluntarily.

WN #2: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 24. Reporting certain matters to Director

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 24. (1) A person who has reasonable grounds to suspect that any of the following has occurred or may occur shall immediately report the suspicion and the information upon which it is based to the Director:
- 1. Improper or incompetent treatment or care of a resident that resulted in harm or a risk of harm to the resident. 2007, c. 8, s. 24 (1), 195 (2).
- 2. Abuse of a resident by anyone or neglect of a resident by the licensee or staff that resulted in harm or a risk of harm to the resident. 2007, c. 8, s. 24 (1), 195 (2).
- 3. Unlawful conduct that resulted in harm or a risk of harm to a resident. 2007, c. 8, s. 24 (1), 195 (2).
- 4. Misuse or misappropriation of a resident's money. 2007, c. 8, s. 24 (1), 195 (2).
- 5. Misuse or misappropriation of funding provided to a licensee under this Act or the Local Health System Integration Act, 2006. 2007, c. 8, s. 24 (1), 195 (2).

## Findings/Faits saillants:



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1. The Licensee has failed to immediately report the suspicion of abuse to the Director and the information upon which it was based to the Director.

During the inspection it was revealed that an incident of alleged abuse occurred and a critical incident report was not initiated to the Director. A review of the home's investigative notes and complaint log as well as Residents progress notes regarding alleged abuse had been reported. The Administrator was aware of the alleged abuse but did not report to the Director. In reviewing the Jarlette Health Services Risk Occurrence Report Section 6-Supervisor's/Unit manager follow up: CIS report section was left incomplete.

Interview with the Administrator confirmed that the home failed to notify the Director of the alleged abuse. The Administrator confirmed the expectation that the suspected abuse of a resident should be immediately reported. [s. 24. (1)]
