## Inspection Summary/Résumé de l'inspection



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The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Critical Incident System inspection.

This inspection was conducted on the following date(s): December 17, 18, 2019.

One intake was completed, regarding improper/incompetent treatment of a resident.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with the Director of Care (DOC), Assistant Director of Care (ADOC) and Personal Support Workers (PSWs).

The Inspector conducted observations of the provision of care provided to the residents, reviewed relevant resident health care records and the home's investigation files related to the CI report.

The following Inspection Protocols were used during this inspection: Falls Prevention
Prevention of Abuse, Neglect and Retaliation

WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 6. Plan of care

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 6. (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that there is a written plan of care for each resident that sets out,
- (a) the planned care for the resident; 2007, c. 8, s. 6 (1).
- (b) the goals the care is intended to achieve; and 2007, c. 8, s. 6 (1).
- (c) clear directions to staff and others who provide direct care to the resident. 2007, c. 8, s. 6 (1).



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### Findings/Faits saillants:

1. The licensee has failed to ensure that there was a written plan of care for each resident that sets out clear directions to staff and others who provided direct care to the resident.

A Critical Incident (CI) report was submitted to the Director, outlining that resident #001 was left unattended which resulted in them falling. Resident #001 was transferred to the hospital for an assessment, resulting in a significant change in health status.

Inspector #542 completed a review of resident #001's health care record. The care plan in place at the time of their fall indicated that they were assessed as a specific risk for falls. The care plan indicated several fall prevention interventions.

Inspector #542 conducted an interview with PSW #100 regarding resident #001's fall prevention interventions. PSW #100 indicated that resident #001 should not have been left unassisted due to their high risk for falls. Furthermore, resident #001 had fall prevention interventions included in their plan of care. They further indicated that the care plan for resident #001 did not indicate clear directions as to whether they could be left unattended.

Inspector #542 interviewed PSW #101 who indicated that they never left resident #001 unattended due to their risk of falls; however, they were unsure if this was included in the resident's plan of care.

Inspector #542 interviewed the Assistant Director of Care (ADOC) and the Director of Care (DOC) regarding the incident. The ADOC and DOC stated that resident #001 should not have been left unattended due to their high risk of falls. The ADOC indicated that the care plan should have been more clear regarding resident #001's fall prevention interventions. [s. 6. (1) (c)]



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### Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that there is a written plan of care for each resident that sets out, c) clear directions to staff and others who provide direct care to the resident, to be implemented voluntarily.
