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WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 33. Bathing Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 33. (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that each resident of the home is bathed, at a minimum, twice a week by the method of his or her choice and more frequently as determined by the resident's hygiene requirements, unless contraindicated by a medical condition. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 33 (1).

#### Findings/Faits saillants:

1. The licensee has failed to ensure that two residents were bathed, at a minimum, twice a week by the method of their choice.

A complaint was received by the Ministry of Long-Term Care concerning sufficient staffing and resident care.

Clinical records showed that two residents did not receive their scheduled baths, and there were no make-up baths documented. A Personal Support Worker (PSW) said that the residents missed their baths because of short staffing. The Director of Care said, the home has had difficulties completing two baths per week for each resident due to issues with sufficient staffing; however, the baths should have been done.

A lack of bathing, at a minimum, twice a week by the method of the residents' choosing, increased the two residents' risk of altered skin integrity.

### Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance with section 33 of the LTCHA, residents must be bathed, at a minimum, twice a week by the method of his or her choice, to be implemented voluntarily.
