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WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: General requirements

Non-compliance with: O. Reg. 246/22, s. 34 (1) 1.

General requirements

- s. 34 (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the following is complied with in respect of each of the organized programs required under sections 11 to 20 of the Act and each of the interdisciplinary programs required under section 53 of this Regulation:
- 1. There must be a written description of the program that includes its goals and objectives and relevant policies, procedures and protocols and provides for methods to reduce risk and monitor outcomes, including protocols for the referral of residents to specialized resources where required.

The licensee has failed to ensure that as per the Fixing Long- Term Care Act, 2021, s. 19 and Ontario Regulation 246/22, s. 94 the licensee must ensure there is a written pest control program that includes relevant policies and procedures. This includes policies for a preventative pest control program as well as procedures specifically related to requirements for immediate action to deal with pests. As per Ontario Regulation 246/22, s. 11 (1) (b), prescribed policy and procedures must be complied with.

The licensee has failed to comply with their pest control program policy #ES-G-20-00, dated August 31, 2023 that required staff to "record the location, number and description of all pest/rodents sighted".

As part of a complaint inspection, non registered staff indicated seeing a specific pest and did not report or document the incident anywhere. A specific incident occurred in the past involving food and pest and the incident was not documented as per policy.
