WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 6. Plan of care

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 6. (10) The licensee shall ensure that the resident is reassessed and the plan of care reviewed and revised at least every six months and at any other time when, (a) a goal in the plan is met; 2007, c. 8, s. 6 (10).
- (b) the resident's care needs change or care set out in the plan is no longer necessary; or 2007, c. 8, s. 6 (10).
- (c) care set out in the plan has not been effective. 2007, c. 8, s. 6 (10).



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Findings/Faits saillants:

1. The licensee failed to ensure that resident #005 was reassessed and the plan of care reviewed and revised when the resident's care needs changed or care set out in the plan was no longer necessary.

The physician had assessed resident #005 in December 2015 at the request of the nursing staff as the resident's condition had deteriorated. After the physician assessed the resident and consulted with the substitute decision maker (SDM) and family, the physician ordered palliative care for the resident. The end of life orders, which included pain management, were implemented; however the written plan of care was not revised to include palliative care for the resident. The home's policy called "Pain Management Program", number 1-1501, and revised August 2014 directed registered staff to continually monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of care for residents' according to their written plan of care, and update as required. Staff #120, #170 and the DOC were interviewed and confirmed that registered staff were expected to revise the written plan of care when the resident's care needs changed. [s. 6. (10) (b)]

Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that the residents' plan of care is reviewed and revised when their care needs change or when care set out in the plan is no longer necessary, to be implemented voluntarily.
