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Required programs

- s. 53 (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the following interdisciplinary programs are developed and implemented in the home:
- 2. A skin and wound care program to promote skin integrity, prevent the development of wounds and pressure injuries, and provide effective skin and wound care interventions.

The licensee has failed to ensure that the skin and wound program was followed in the home.

In accordance with O. Reg. 246/22 s. 11 (1) (b), the licensee was required to ensure that the written policies developed for the skin and wound management program were complied with.

The home's Skin and Wound Program: Wound Care Management policy states that staff are to promptly report changes in skin integrity observed during daily care to the nurse for immediate assessment. A Personal Support Worker (PSW) did not immediately report to the nurse an area of altered skin integrity on a resident when it was initially identified. The concern was reported to the nurse by a different staff member later in the day once it was identified.

Skin and wound care



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s. 55 (2) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that,

(b) a resident exhibiting altered skin integrity, including skin breakdown, pressure injuries, skin tears or wounds,

(ii) receives immediate treatment and interventions to reduce or relieve pain, promote healing, and prevent infection, as required,

The licensee has failed to immediately assess and treat an area of altered skin integrity on a resident when a Personal Support Worker (PSW) failed to report the skin concern to a nurse.
