During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with Administrator, Director of Resident Care (DRC), Resident Care Manager(RCM), Registered Nurse (RN), Registered Practical Nurse(RPN), Personal Support Worker(PSW), Dietary Aide(DA), Infection control nurse and Resident.

Also completed in the inspection, observation provision of staff to resident care, meal service, toileting, identified resident home area and infection control practices. Review of identified clinical health records and relevant policies.

WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 50. Skin and wound care

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 50. (2) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that,
- (b) a resident exhibiting altered skin integrity, including skin breakdown, pressure ulcers, skin tears or wounds,
- (i) receives a skin assessment by a member of the registered nursing staff, using a clinically appropriate assessment instrument that is specifically designed for skin and wound assessment,
- (ii) receives immediate treatment and interventions to reduce or relieve pain, promote healing, and prevent infection, as required,
- (iii) is assessed by a registered dietitian who is a member of the staff of the home, and any changes made to the resident's plan of care relating to nutrition and hydration are implemented, and
- (iv) is reassessed at least weekly by a member of the registered nursing staff, if clinically indicated; O. Reg. 79/10, s. 50 (2).

Findings/Faits saillants:

1. The licensee has failed to ensure that Resident #01 exhibiting altered skin integrity, received a skin assessment by a member of the registered nursing staff, using a clinically appropriate assessment instrument that is specifically designed for skin and wound assessment.

During interview DOC indicated that it was the home's practice and her expectation that if a resident's experienced a change in skin integrity a skin assessment would be completed in the Point Click Care (PCC) for the resident. She also indicated that weekly assessments would be completed using the skin assessment tool in PCC by the Registered staff.

Review of the licensee's "Skin and Wound care" policy, indicates that a skin assessment in PCC would be completed quarterly and when there is a change in health status. The policy defines, Altered skin integrity - "Potential or actual disruption of epidermal or dermal tissue"

Complainant has indicated in an interview and letter to the Director that on an identified date it was noted that an alteration in Resident #01"s skin was observed. Twenty one days later the area is described as getting progressively worse and spreading. Three days later the complainant observed the skin alteration in another area on resident #01 that appeared the same as the others. Four days after that another area was observed with the same alterations in the skin.

Resident #01 progress notes indicate that;

- -on an identified date two areas of skin alteration are noted on resident #01's foot
- -twenty one days later the areas are described as worsening and spreading.
- -three days later the physician is into assess and diagnosis is provided.

Review of the assessment portion in Point click care (PCC) was completed and there is no evidence of a skin assessment being completed for Resident #1 for the Period of when the area is noted to be worsening and physician provides a diagnosis. [s. 50. (2) (b) (i)]

Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance by ensuring that resident's with altered skin integrity, received a skin assessment by a member of the registered nursing staff, using a clinically appropriate assessment instrument that is specifically designed for skin and wound assessment, to be implemented voluntarily.
