**WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Reporting and Complaints**

**NC #001 Written Notification pursuant to FLTCA, 2021, s. 154 (1) 1.**

Non-compliance with: O. Reg. 79/10, s. 107 (3.1) (b)

The licensee failed to ensure that an incident that resulted in an injury and the resident was transferred to hospital was reported to the Director within three business days of the licensee becoming aware of the resident's significant change in condition.

Rational and Summary

A resident sustained an injury and was transferred to hospital. Three days later an update of the resident's status was obtained from the hospital. A Critical Incident System (CIS) report was submitted thirteen days later.

The Director of Resident Care and Administrator acknowledged that the CIS report should have been submitted sooner.
