# WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Infection Prevention and Control Program

NC #001 Written Notification pursuant to FLTCA, 2021, s. 154 (1) 1.

Non-compliance with: O. Reg. 246/22, s. 102 (2) (b)

Infection prevention and control program s. 102 (2) The licensee shall implement,

(b) any standard or protocol issued by the Director with respect to infection prevention and control. O. Reg. 246/22, s. 102 (2).

The licensee has failed to ensure the implementation of any standard, or protocol issued by the Director with respect to infection prevention and control (IPAC).

Section 9.1 (f) of the IPAC Standard for Long-Term Care Homes (revised September 2023) states, the licensee shall ensure that Routine Practices and Additional Precautions are followed in the IPAC program. At minimum, Additional Precautions shall include additional Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) requirements including appropriate selection application, removal and disposal.

Specifically, a staff member did not wear the required PPE when providing care to a resident on additional precautions.
