Inspection Summary/Résumé de l'inspection

The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Critical Incident inspection.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with the Director of Administration (DOA), the Director of Care (DOC), the Social Worker(SW), the Associate Director of Care (ADOC), one Registered Practical Nurse (RPN), two Personal Support Workers (PSW), a family member and the resident.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) observed the resident, reviewed the residents health record, and reviewed the homes documentation

Non-compliance with requirements under the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007 (LTCHA) was found. (A requirement under the LTCHA includes the requirements contained in the items listed in the definition of "requirement under this Act" in subsection 2(1) of the LTCHA.) The following constitutes written notification of non-compliance under paragraph 1 of section 152 of the LTCHA. WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 24. Reporting certain matters to Director

Specifically failed to comply with the following subsections:

s. 24. (1) A person who has reasonable grounds to suspect that any of the following has occurred or may occur shall immediately report the suspicion and the information upon which it is based to the Director:

- 1. Improper or incompetent treatment or care of a resident that resulted in harm or a risk of harm to the resident.**
- 2. Abuse of a resident by anyone or neglect of a resident by the licensee or staff that resulted in harm or a risk of harm to the resident.**
- 3. Unlawful conduct that resulted in harm or a risk of harm to a resident.**
- 4. Misuse or misappropriation of a resident's money.**
- 5. Misuse or misappropriation of funding provided to a licensee under this Act or the Local Health System Integration Act, 2006. 2007, c. 8, ss. 24 (1), 195 (2).**

Findings/Faits saillants :

The licensee, who had reasonable grounds to suspect improper or incompetent treatment or care of a resident that resulted in injury failed to immediately notify the Director.

Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure when there is reasonable grounds to suspect improper or incompetent treatment or care of a resident that results in harm or risk of harm, is immediately reported to the director, to be implemented voluntarily.

WN #2: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 76. Training

Specifically failed to comply with the following subsections:

s. 76. (2) Every licensee shall ensure that no person mentioned in subsection (1) performs their responsibilities before receiving training in the areas mentioned below:

1. The Residents' Bill of Rights.
2. The long-term care home's mission statement.
3. The long-term care home's policy to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents.
4. The duty under section 24 to make mandatory reports.
5. The protections afforded by section 26.
6. The long-term care home's policy to minimize the restraining of residents.
7. Fire prevention and safety.
8. Emergency and evacuation procedures.
9. Infection prevention and control.
10. All Acts, regulations, policies of the Ministry and similar documents, including policies of the licensee, that are relevant to the person's responsibilities.
11. Any other areas provided for in the regulations. 2007, c. 8, s. 76. (2).

s. 76. (4) Every licensee shall ensure that the persons who have received training under subsection (2) receive retraining in the areas mentioned in that subsection at times or at intervals provided for in the regulations. 2007, c. 8, s. 76. (4).

Findings/Faits saillants :

Review of the homes attendance records on abuse prevention training for 2010 & 2011 indicated that three staff did not receive annual re-training on the homes policy to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents. (ref.s.76(4))
2. Orientation was not provided regarding incident reporting or the homes abuse policy. (ref.s.76(2)3, 4)

Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that all current staff receive re-training regarding the long-term care home's policy to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents and mandatory reports, to be implemented voluntarily.

WN #3: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 20. Policy to promote zero tolerance

Specifically failed to comply with the following subsections:

s. 20. (1) Without in any way restricting the generality of the duty provided for in section 19, every licensee shall ensure that there is in place a written policy to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents, and shall ensure that the policy is complied with. 2007, c. 8, s. 20 (1).

Findings/Faits saillants :



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1. Review of the policy (V3-010) Abuse and Neglect Resident (revised July 2011) indicated:

-annual mandatory education will be provided to all staff.

-if any employee witnesses an incident or has any knowledge of an incident, that constitutes abuse or neglect, are responsible to take immediate steps:

The charge nurse:

1) check the resident status; if required, immediate medical attention must be sought; 2) inform the POA or the family; 3) contact the DOA or designate

The DOA or designate:

1) immediately notify the police; 2) document the current resident status on the residents record and complete a critical incident report; 3) report (as per section 24 of the LTCHA 2007); if outside normal business hours, contact the toll free action line.

The DOA:

1) begin investigation; 2) submit a critical incident report

2. The licensee failed to ensure that when staff became aware of an alleged staff to resident abuse incident that the home's policy was complied with.
