# WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Continence care and bowel management

NC #001 Written Notification pursuant to FLTCA, 2021, s. 154 (1) 1.

Non-compliance with: O. Reg. 246/22, s. 56 (2) (h) (iii)

Continence care and bowel management

- s. 56 (2) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that,
- (h) residents are provided with a range of continence care products that,
- (iii) promote resident comfort, ease of use, dignity and good skin integrity,

The licensee has failed to ensure that residents are provided with a range of continence care products that, promote resident comfort, ease of use, dignity and good skin integrity.

## Rationale and Summary

Fabric bags were observed hanging in resident rooms which contained rags of various material for use as continence care wipes. Cut up rags were also observed in the clean utility room in bin with signage stating "L.T.C. Wipes".

The DOC confirmed that the home supplies rags for continence care, and disposable wet wipes had been personally supplied by staff in the home or family members of residents based on their preference.

A review of an audit conducted by the DOC determined that rags were found present in multiple resident rooms.



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Interviews with staff and the DOC confirmed that the rags were cut from old bed sheets, towels, and clothing including articles from deceased residents; and material used for rags had been determined based on staff discretion.
