The licensee has failed to ensure that any standard or protocol issued by the Director with respect to IPAC, was implemented.

The IPAC Standard for Long-Term Care Home (LTCHs), revised in September 2023, section 5.3 (h), indicates that the licensee shall ensure that the policies and procedures for the IPAC program include policies and procedures for the implementation of Routine Practices and Additional Precautions, including but not limited to cleaning and disinfection.

According to the home's Mechanical Lift Usage, Cleaning, and Disinfectant Policy and Procedure, all mechanical lifts must be cleaned and disinfected after each use to minimize the risk of infection transmission.

A Personal Support Worker (PSW) and a student PSW transferred a resident using a Hoyer Lift. The PSW then placed the Hoyer lift in the tub room without disinfecting it.

The PSW confirmed that they returned and disinfected the Hoyer Lift after completing an interview with the Inspector.
