Inspection Summary/Résumé de l'inspection



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The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Critical Incident System inspection.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) reviewed the Critical Incident Report related to the December 2013 power outage; checked the availability of a generator and back up power supply equipment; observed the provided generator and set up.

WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 19. Generators Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 19. (4) The licensee of a home to which subsection (2) or (3) applies shall ensure, not later than six months after the day this section comes into force, that the home has guaranteed access to a generator that will be operational within three hours of a power outage and that can maintain everything required under clauses (1) (a), (b) and (c). O. Reg. 79/10, s. 19 (4).

Findings/Faits saillants:



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1. Critical Incident Report (CIR) # 2511- 000003-13 identifies that the home was affected by a power outage commencing December 21, 2013 at 21:30 and lasting until power was restored to the home on December 24, 2013 at 12:45.

During the identified power outage, on site generator capacity was provided that maintained the heating system; emergency lighting and some of the dietary services equipment necessary to support meal and snack services to residents.

During the power outage, the elevator, the resident staff communication and response system, safety and emergency equipment including the door security systems on resident accessible doors leading to stairways and non secure areas outside of the home, were not operational. It was reported in the CIR that the fire panel was running on battery power.

During the inspection at the home on May 13, 2014 it was confirmed that the home does not have guaranteed access to a generator that will be operational within 3 hours of a power outage and that can maintain all essential services required under O. Reg. 79/10, s. 19 (1) (c):

- -the elevator
- -the resident staff communication and response system
- -safety and emergency equipment including, but not limited to, the door security systems on resident accessible doors leading to stairways and non secure areas outside of the home; the fire safety system.

During a prolonged power outage, residents are placed at increased risk for harm. Health, comfort, safety and well being are potentially compromised by the loss of essential services. Residents are at increased risk for elopement, falls, etc. without operational safety and security systems and no functioning elevator in the 2 storey long term care home. [s. 19. (4)]

Additional Required Actions:

CO # - 001 will be served on the licensee. Refer to the "Order(s) of the Inspector".

WN #2: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 9. Doors in a home



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Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 9. (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the following rules are complied with:
- 1. All doors leading to stairways and the outside of the home other than doors leading to secure outside areas that preclude exit by a resident, including balconies and terraces, or doors that residents do not have access to must be,
 - i. kept closed and locked,
- ii.equipped with a door access control system that is kept on at all times, and iii.equipped with an audible door alarm that allows calls to be cancelled only at the point of activation and,
- A. is connected to the resident-staff communication and response system, or
- B. is connected to an audio visual enunciator that is connected to the nurses' station nearest to the door and has a manual reset switch at each door. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 9; O. Reg. 363/11, s. 1 (1, 2).
- 2. All doors leading to non-residential areas must be equipped with locks to restrict unsupervised access to those areas by residents, and those doors must be kept closed and locked when they are not being supervised by staff. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 9; O. Reg. 363/11, s. 1 (1, 2).
- 3. Any locks on bedrooms, washrooms, toilet or shower rooms must be designed and maintained so they can be readily released from the outside in an emergency. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 9. (1).
- 4. All alarms for doors leading to the outside must be connected to a back-up power supply, unless the home is not served by a generator, in which case the staff of the home shall monitor the doors leading to the outside in accordance with the procedures set out in the home's emergency plans. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 9. (1).

Findings/Faits saillants:

1. The home is equipped with an on site generator. Alarms for doors leading to the outside are not connected to the back up power supply. [s. 9. (1) 4.]



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Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that alarms for doors leading to the outside are connected to the back up power supply, to be implemented voluntarily.
