## INSPECTION RESULTS

### WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Nutritional Care and Hydration

#### Programs

NC #001 Written Notification pursuant to FLTCA, 2021, s. 154 (1) 1.

**Non-compliance with: O. Reg. 246/22, s. 75 1.**

Weight changes

s. 75. Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that residents with the following weight changes are assessed using an interdisciplinary approach, and that actions are taken and outcomes are evaluated:

1. A change of 5 per cent of body weight, or more, over one month.

The licensee failed to ensure that when a resident had a greater than 5 per cent change in body weight over a one month period, that they were assessed using an interdisciplinary approach, and that actions were taken and outcomes were evaluated.

#### **Rational and Summary:**

A resident experienced a change of more than 5 per cent of body weight in a one month period. There was no dietary referral or assessment of the resident regarding their weight change.

When an interdisciplinary assessment was not initiated or completed in response to the resident's weight change, contributing factors were not identified, and actions

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were not taken to mitigate further deterioration or nutritional risk.
