Responsive behaviours

- s. 58 (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the following are developed to meet the needs of residents with responsive behaviours:
- 1. Written approaches to care, including screening protocols, assessment, reassessment and identification of behavioural triggers that may result in responsive behaviours, whether cognitive, physical, emotional, social, environmental or other.

The licensee has failed to comply with the home's Dementia Care Responsive Behavior Huddle Policy when staff did not complete the responsive behavior huddle form after a resident demonstrated responsive behaviors on a date in 2025.

In accordance with O. Reg 246/22, s. 11 (1) (b), the licensee is required to ensure that written policies developed for managing responsive behaviors were complied with.

Specifically, the home's Dementia Care Responsive Behavior Huddle policy indicated the home was to complete the responsive behavior huddle form for every responsive behavior, to capture the antecedents and triggers, which did not occur for the resident.
