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## **INSPECTION RESULTS**

### WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Recreational and Social Activities Qualifications

NC #001 Written Notification pursuant to FLTCA, 2021, s. 154 (1) 1. Non-compliance with: O.Reg. 246/22, s. 73 (1)

The licensee has failed to ensure that staff members who provided recreational and social activities in the home had a post-secondary diploma or degree in recreation and leisure studies, therapeutic recreation, kinesiology or other related field from a community college or university; or were enrolled in a community college or university in a diploma or degree program in such a field.

Multiple staff members worked in the activities department. It was identified that the staff members had not completed any of the requirements to obtain a diploma or degree, as laid out within the Ontario Regulations 246/22, nor were they enrolled in a community college or university in a diploma or degree program in such a field.

The recreation and activities manager acknowledged that multiple staff members had not provided proof of certification or been enrolled in a program to obtain a diploma or degree to meet the requirements laid out within the Ontario Regulations 246/22.

### WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Cooks

NC #002 Written Notification pursuant to FLTCA, 2021, s. 154 (1) 1. Non-compliance with: O.Reg. 246/22, s. 82 (2)

The licensee has failed to ensure that a cook referred to in subsection (1), hired after July 1, 2010, had a required diploma or certificate, as laid out within the regulations.

A staff member was hired as a cook for the home and it was identified that they had not completed any of the requirements to obtain a diploma or certificate, as laid out within the Ontario Regulations 246/22,



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for the cook position. The staff member performed the duties of a cook for a period of time, before they were transferred to a different department within the home.

The Administrator acknowledged that the staff member had not provided proof of certification when they were hired as a cook and that they worked as a cook, without the appropriate diploma or certification to perform the duties.
