## Inspection Summary/Résumé de l'inspection



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The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Complaint inspection.

This inspection was conducted on the following date(s): December 11, 15, 2015 and January 21, 2016

During the course of this inspection, the inspector: viewed a video recording submitted by the complainant; reviewed the health records of identified residents, staff files, the home's internal investigation notes, incident reports, policies and procedures; and observed residents in the care area.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with the Administrator/DOC, Assistant DOC (ADOC), registered staff, Personal Support Workers (PSW's), residents and family members.

WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 6. Plan of care

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 6. (7) The licensee shall ensure that the care set out in the plan of care is provided to the resident as specified in the plan. 2007, c. 8, s. 6 (7).

Findings/Faits saillants :



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- 1. The licensee has failed to ensure that the care set out in the plan of care was provided to the resident as specified in the plan.
- A) On a date in August 2015, a PSW was observed to be providing care unassisted to an identified resident. The resident was observed to be distressed. The plan of care for August 2015 directed staff to provide care with two staff persons for the entire process. The ADOC confirmed that care was not provided as specified in the plan of care.
- B) On another date in August 2015, another PSW was observed to be providing care and turning and repositioning an identified resident without the assistance of a second staff person.
- C) On a date in August 2015 a PSW was observed to not speak to an identified resident upon entering the resident's room. The PSW did not explain anything that the PSW was doing while providing personal care. The plan of care directed staff to "explain tasks to be completed before attempting care to reduce resistive behaviours"; and to "give resident clear concise explanation of anything about to occur".

The ADOC confirmed that care was not provided to the identified resident as specified in the plan of care in the above instances. [s. 6. (7)]

## Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that the care set out in the plan of care is provided to the resident as specified in the plan, to be implemented voluntarily.

WN #2: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 19. Duty to protect

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 19. (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall protect residents from abuse by anyone and shall ensure that residents are not neglected by the licensee or staff. 2007, c. 8, s. 19 (1).



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#### Findings/Faits saillants:

- 1. The licensee has failed to ensure that an identified resident was protected from abuse by anyone.
- A) Evidence was provided to the home and the LTC inspector that depicted the following:

On a date in August 2015 two identified PSW's were observed in a resident's room on two separate occasions. During the provision of care, the PSW's verbally and emotionally abused the resident during the first occasion. On the second occasion, the same two PSW's were observed to be making faces at and mocking the resident while providing care. The resident was distressed. The administrator/DOC confirmed that the observed staff behaviours were staff to resident abuse.

The home's internal investigation of the incidents resulted in disciplinary action.

The resident was verbally and emotionally abused by staff as confirmed by the complainant and the Administrator/DOC. [s. 19. (1)]

## Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that residents are protected from abuse by anyone and shall ensure that residents are not neglected by the licensee or staff,, to be implemented voluntarily.

WN #3: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 36. Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that staff use safe transferring and positioning devices or techniques when assisting residents. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 36.

### Findings/Faits saillants:



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1. The licensee has failed to ensure that staff used safe transferring and positioning devices or techniques when assisting residents.

Resident #001 was being transferred by staff to resident's room on a date in November 2015. According to the health record and a verbal report by the ADOC, the resident suffered injury as a result of improper transferring.

#### Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that staff use safe transferring and positioning devices or techniques when assisting residents,, to be implemented voluntarily.

WN #4: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 51. Continence care and bowel management
Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 51. (2) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that, (g) residents who require continence care products have sufficient changes to remain clean, dry and comfortable; and O. Reg. 79/10, s. 51 (2).

## Findings/Faits saillants:

1. The licensee failed to ensure that, (g) residents who required continence care products had sufficient changes to remain clean, dry and comfortable

On a date in December 2015 an identified resident who required the use of continence care products was observed to not receive sufficient changes to remain clean and dry. This was confirmed by the ADOC and a family member.



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WN #5: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 98. Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the appropriate police force is immediately notified of any alleged, suspected or witnessed incident of abuse or neglect of a resident that the licensee suspects may constitute a criminal offence. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 98.

## Findings/Faits saillants:

- 1. The licensee has failed to ensure that the appropriate police force was immediately notified of any alleged, suspected or witnessed incident of abuse or neglect of a resident that the licensee suspects may constitute a criminal offence.
- A) When provided with evidence of staff to resident abusive actions that may have constituted a criminal offence, the home failed to notify the police as confirmed by the Admin/DOC and ADOC. [s. 98.]
