Safe storage of drugs

s. 138 (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that,
(b) controlled substances are stored in a separate, double-locked stationary cupboard in the locked area or stored in a separate locked area within the locked medication cart.

A controlled substance was not stored in a double-locked stationary cupboard in the locked area. During inspector observation of the locked medication room on the Trillium unit, it was observed that there was no double-lock system in place for the controlled substance, injectable Ativan. It was stored in a locked tackle box in a fridge that was not locked.
