## WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Plan of Care

Plan of care

s. 6 (2) The licensee shall ensure that the care set out in the plan of care is based on an assessment of the resident and on the needs and preferences of that resident.

The licensee has failed to ensure that the care set out in the plan of care was based on an assessment of a resident and on the needs and preferences of that resident, as the resident's diet texture was changed following an incident. The incident occurred while the resident was eating rice which was served to residents who ate regular and minced foods. The resident and their substitute decision-maker's (SDM) preference was to have removed rice from the resident's diet and not have the diet texture changed.
