### Inspection Summary/Résumé de l'inspection



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The purpose of this inspection was to conduct a Resident Quality Inspection inspection.

This inspection was conducted on the following date(s): August 24, 25, 26, 28, 31, and September 1, 2015

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) spoke with the Administrator, the Director of Care, the Dietary Manager, the Resident Program Manager, the Support Services Manager, the RAI Coordinator, the Social Worker, one Maintenance, four Registered Nursing Assistants, three Registered Nurses, nine Personal Support Workers, one Health Care Aide, four family members, and forty-one residents.

During the course of the inspection, the inspector(s) also conducted a tour of the resident home areas and common areas, observed a meal service, observed residents and care provided to them. Medication administration and storage areas were observed. Reviewed clinical records of identified residents, policies and procedures, meeting minutes, and other pertinent records pertaining to the inspection.

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WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 3. Residents' Bill of Rights

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

- s. 3. (1) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that the following rights of residents are fully respected and promoted:
- 11. Every resident has the right to,
- i. participate fully in the development, implementation, review and revision of his or her plan of care,
- ii. give or refuse consent to any treatment, care or services for which his or her consent is required by law and to be informed of the consequences of giving or refusing consent,
- iii. participate fully in making any decision concerning any aspect of his or her care, including any decision concerning his or her admission, discharge or transfer to or from a long-term care home or a secure unit and to obtain an independent opinion with regard to any of those matters, and
- iv. have his or her personal health information within the meaning of the Personal Health Information Protection Act, 2004 kept confidential in accordance with that Act, and to have access to his or her records of personal health information, including his or her plan of care, in accordance with that Act. 2007, c. 8, s. 3 (1).

Findings/Faits saillants:



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1. The licensee failed to ensure that every resident had his or her personal health information within the meaning of the Personal Health Information Protection Act, 2004 kept confidential in accordance with that Act.

Observation on August 31, 2015, of two medication carts revealed cellophane medication packages with legible Personal Health Information (PHI) in garbage bags on the medication carts.

Interview with a Registered staff confirmed the observation of the cellophane medication packages with legible Personal Health Information (PHI) in garbage bags on the medication cart. Registered staff shared that the garbage was thrown into the regular garbage for pick up, without denaturing of the PHI.

Record review of the Medical Pharmacies Pharmacy Policy & Procedure Manual revealed, Section 3 The Medication Pass, Policy 3-6. "Empty strip pouches can be destroyed with water to remove information and placed in to the garbage or shredded (PIPEDA)."

Interview with the Director of Care (DOC) on August 31, 2015, confirmed that it was the expectation of the home for staff to dispose of the cellophane medication wrappers by altering or denaturing the Personal Health Information. [s. 3. (1) 11. iv.]

### Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that personal health information within the meaning of the Personal Health Information Protection Act, 2004 be kept confidential in accordance with that Act,, to be implemented voluntarily.
