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WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with LTCHA, 2007 S.O. 2007, c.8, s. 44. Authorization for admission to a home

Specifically failed to comply with the following:

s. 44. (9) If the licensee withholds approval for admission, the licensee shall give to persons described in subsection (10) a written notice setting out, (a) the ground or grounds on which the licensee is withholding approval; 2007, c.

Findings/Faits saillants :





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1. The licensee failed to ensure that if the licensee withholds approval for admission, the licensee shall give to persons described in subsection (10) a written notice setting out detailed explanation of the supporting facts, as they relate both to the home and to the applicant's condition and requirements for care.

A complaint was received by the Ministry of Health by applicant #001, reporting that the long-term-care (LTC) home wrongfully refused his/her admission.

A review of the withholding of approval of admission letter sent to the applicant on an identified date, revealed the home responded to the applicant that the home was not able to approve his/her application to the home because his/her care needs are greater than the home can provide and staff in the home does not have adequate resources to support the strategies necessary to provide care in a safe and effective manner. The explanation letter to CCAC revealed that the withholding of the application was based on the applicant's need for an identified medical treatmentand the home's lack of nursing resources and expertise to mange these care needs.

A review of the CCAC referral documents revealed that according to the cognitive and physical status the applicant was able to perform duties of everyday living such as locomotion in and out of the building and safe use of his/her upper extremities. If he was assessed as being unsafe to do activities out of the building independently staff are not obligated and generally will not assist the patient in any way to perform them. Further review of the CCAC documents revealed that the client had a conversation with the home that the home had no policy in place for users of the particular treatment.

An interview with the home's administrator indicated that letter sent to the client did not set out a detailed explanation of the supporting facts, as they relate both to the home and to the applicant's condition and requirements for care; when the licensee withheld the approval for admission.
