WRITTEN NOTIFICATION: Qualifications of personal support workers

Non-compliance with: O. Reg. 246/22, s. 52 (4)

Qualifications of personal support workers

s. 52 (4) A licensee of a long-term care home is not required to comply with the requirements set out in this section until January 1, 2026, as long as the person hired as a personal support worker or to provide personal support services, in the reasonable opinion of the licensee, has the adequate skills, training and knowledge to perform the duties required of that position.

The licensee failed to ensure that every person hired by the licensee as a personal support worker, in the reasonable opinion of the licensee, had the adequate skills, training and knowledge to perform the duties required of that position.

The home had used an agency for their Personal Support Worker (PSW) staffing needs for a specified time in 2025. An interview with a staff member confirmed the home was unable to determine that these staff had the adequate skills, training and knowledge to perform the duties required of the position as no documents had been obtained for these staff and their qualifications reviewed, prior to their hire.
